A Message to Annual General Meeting Delegations from the Bishop

Greetings in the Name of the One who loves and calls us.

For all who embark upon the journey and work of an Annual General Meeting this year, you have done so with generosity, adaptability and resilience. On behalf of your neighbouring parishes and deaneries, and national Church I pour out thanksgiving to God for you.

We experience our call to mission and ministry anew each day, and perhaps the extraordinary events of the past year have made us yearn to hear God's voice and direction more than we have yearned in past. The discipline of engaging an AGM is not simply to fulfil civil and canon law, which they do, it is also a significant moment to be the Body of Christ huddled in an upper room listening to the resurrected master prepare us for a life of mission and ministry.

Our collective ministries of The Diocese of Rupert's Land are essential for the health of every parish, and ministry in Canada generally, and I am speaking particularly of the work of the Urban Indigenous Ministry Developer, the Diocesan Ministry Developer, our contribution through General Synod for Council of the North, and the overall structures of the Anglican Church of Canada that generously resource parish and clergy development. Your generosity in ministry through Common Ministry and Mission when fully realized means that Rupert's Land Discipleship shall not lack for anything. As one Body in Christ we are indeed gifted with all that is necessary to meet the needs of ministry and mission.

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Disciples, let us be one in the daily recitation of Luke 4.18-19, and in prayer for our Diocesan Church family:

Rector's Report – February 2021

My brothers and sisters,

It has been almost a year since we have gathered together physically in our church building. Time has gone by so very quickly as it often does. In those early days, there were many of us who thought and hoped that our exile would be much shorter than it has actually been; that maybe we would be back for Easter 2020. Alas, this did not happen and as of today, the virus continues to plague our global community. Understandably, we would all like things to return to normal; yet we need to be open to the fact that we may be in this for the "long haul" and more importantly, we need to plan accordingly. As difficult as this thought is, it is nothing new to the Christian community. Back in the earliest history of the Church, Christians believed that Jesus would return imminently; in their lifetime. When Paul wrote 1 Thessalonians, our earliest recorded Christian scripture, he was convinced that Jesus would return while he and the other apostles were still alive. After years of waiting and hoping, the early church ultimately came to the stark realization that Jesus' second coming had been delayed, and that they would be in this for the "long haul"; a painful realization to be sure, yet one which energized the early Christian movement to think beyond its present reality and to expand its vision to include a long and uncertain future.

I want to take this opportunity to thank each one of you for your patient understanding as we pave the way for a new reality. I know this has not been easy. For some of you, the church is like your family. COVID fatigue is setting in. We are weary of all the restrictions, fearful of getting sick or spreading the virus to someone we love, tired of the loneliness, the business shutdowns and the waiting for vaccines. We miss the corporate prayers, the Eucharist, the after-church coffee hour, the church suppers and fairs, the hymns and all those things which define us and bring so much meaning to our lives. Yet in spite of all that, we continue to remain faithful and refuse to lose hope. I suppose if this pandemic has accomplished anything positive, it has been a renewed definition of faith.

I want to thank our Wardens, Fran Anderson and Wendy Henderson, who have been working tirelessly throughout this past year. Their leadership has been stellar. Bob Wedlake, our Treasurer, also deserves a word of thanks. As you know, this pandemic has resulted in some financial hardships, yet in spite of that, Bob has managed to keep us afloat. I encourage you to take Bob's report seriously (both the negative and the positive parts), and to do all that you can to share our financial burden. I want to also mention Frank Martin, who took over as Envelope Secretary when Dave Moran became ill and subsequently passed away. Thank you all!

I am always hesitant to name individual people in expressing thanks, so let me share what a typical month might have looked like in our parish this past year.

Worship: We have so many committed participants in our weekly worship service. Some like James Alexander and Melissa Seadon (our choristers, liturgists, organizers) and Huery Rances (our Music Director/pianist, camera person and online editor), have specific ongoing tasks and are present each week. We have Deacon Val Christopherson and soon-to-be Deacon Susan Roe-Finley who provide our diaconal ministry (so grateful for that), as well as a list of very committed folk who are scheduled to participate in the readings and prayers.

Building/Grounds: We are so grateful for the work of Wayne Williams and all the members of the building and grounds committee. With two buildings to care for, one can only imagine the commitment involved. And we now have an accessible washroom just waiting to be used! I'm also grateful for the work of Wolfgang Huber, Ross Wheeler and Ted Henderson, who have been in and out on a regular basis keeping our building and grounds in such tip-top shape.

Pandemic Response Team: This group of diverse and scientifically motivated individuals was set up on the last day of our in-church gathering back in 2020. To that end, we have been meeting monthly, often more, to assess our current status with the pandemic and to determine our best response accordingly. Our task is to keep our parish running smoothly until that day when we are able to safely reopen our doors for indoor gatherings.

Vestry: Our Vestry continues to be the glue that keeps our parish together. Interestingly, we have met less often than we are accustomed to, mostly because many of our members are also part of the Pandemic Response Team. That being said, our Vestry continues to monitor the life of our community, delegating tasks when necessary and making sure we are fulfilling our responsibilities as a governing body.

Harvest Manitoba Food Bank and St. Matthews Emergency Food Pantry: Where would we be without these ministries? In keeping with the words of Matthew's Jesus, "When I was hungry you gave me something to eat"; our faithful volunteers, under the leadership of Aaron Sawchuk and Terry Martin, continue to provide nutritious food to members of our community through our Mission Centre location. Thanks to all who are involved in both the setting up and distribution of food. These are troubling times and we, and dozens of Winnipeggers, are so thankful for your dedication. As well, many thanks to everyone who dropped off donations at the church for the St. Matthews Emergency Food Pantry, and to Ted Henderson for delivering them to St. Matthews Community Ministry.

Special Events: As you know, all our Special Events this past year were cancelled. This has been hard for us, both socially and financially. Nonetheless, I continue to be thankful for the work of that committee. What that will look like this year, remains to be seen; but I am confident we will pull through and when we do, the Special Events Committee will be there to assist in our reopening. On a related note, I want to thank Dianna Allan who has faithfully kept in touch with the parish through her phone calls and personal contacts. I know how much this has been appreciated by all of us.

And where do we go from here?

Well, the short answer is; we carry on the best we can. This exilic period will come to an end. Exiles always do. And from my understanding of Holy Scripture, exiles always bring about renewal. Here is the pattern as I understand it: Exile followed by lament. Lament followed by soul searching. Soul searching followed by hope. Hope followed by return. Return followed by new life and vision for the renewed community of faith. Hang in there my brothers and sisters.

And in the meantime:

- 1. We continue to listen to the science and our diocesan guidelines for a safe reopening.
- 2. We continue to provide online worship services with special attention to our high holidays and feast days.
- 3. We keep in touch with each other in a way that makes most sense.
- 4. We will feed the poor as we are able through the work of our Food Bank and donations to St. Matthews.
- 5. We will seek to provide outreach both here and abroad in whatever way we can.
- 6. We will ponder the positive implications this pandemic has had on us and on society.
- 7. We will name the negative effects of this virus, and in particular the ways in which it has impacted the lives of the most vulnerable. We will respond accordingly.
- 8. We will have a Holy Lent. Please be advised that we are working on a very exciting virtual Lenten program. Details will follow!!
- 9. Any ideas? Suggestions? Let us know.

Yes, it would appear that we may be in this for the long haul. Vaccines are coming which is a good thing. Canadians are a resilient people and one day we will turn the page and this pandemic will be history. For now, we will lean upon the faith that is within us, and that has been part of our tradition from the very beginning. In God, we have all that we need to accomplish anything that is before us. We are part of a larger story, a story of challenges being overcome, impossible dreams being realized and death giving way to life.

Please continue to keep in touch with one another. Our website and Facebook always provide current information. Share our story with those you love. May God grant you peace.

Service Production Report

My primary role here at St. Francis is to direct the choir and to organize and provide the music for Sunday services and special services such as Christmas. I am to lead choir practices on Thursdays from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM and provide Sunday service music from 11:00 AM to end of service. Due to current circumstances my current function within the church has evolved.

I am responsible for the recording, production, editing, and publication of weekly services on Sundays and also special services. I also record original piano playing for the recordings with the help of Melissa and James who sing the hymns in accordance with current health guidelines. The recording and editing equipment I use is my own.

That said, here is the detailed outline for every step of the production: Setup of Lighting and Sound:

The lights of the main church hall and auxiliary lights provided by Melissa and James are used to
properly light the altar area for recording. Candles are occasionally used for lighting purposes.
 During the summer and early fall, natural light was sufficient for recording.

Setup of Camera Equipment:

• Early recordings through the summer were done with my own smartphone attached to a phone clamp tripod mount. Eventually a camera tripod lent to us by Bob Wedlake was used to mount the phone clamp. Around fall we started using a DSLR camera and a different tripod.

Service Music:

• Music is recorded after the service portion with Melissa and James. I provide the piano and they provide vocals. We practice individual hymns before recording them.

Editing:

- I transfer the video files to an external hard drive and number them chronologically. Using a video editing software called DaVinci Resolve, I place the video segments in the appropriate order, crop them, and add fade to the start and end of each segment.
- I also add on-screen text for the hymns and service music. I usually type them out myself, taking up half of the overall time editing. Now, Fran sends the lyrics to me and I simply copy and paste them. It drastically reduces the amount of time needed to edit.

Processing & Publication:

- Once the video is edited and looked over, it is saved and rendered as a .mp4 file and saved to the external hard drive.
- Next the video is uploaded and processed on YouTube on our "The Anglican Parish of St Francis

 Winnipeg" channel. I add the title and the description of the video. I try to think of something encouraging or fun to write for the description. The video is supposed to be scheduled for public viewing by 6:30 PM on the day before the Sunday it is meant for. The rendering and upload processing is the most time-consuming part of production.

Approximate time for recording a single service is 1.5 hours. Approximate time for editing the video is 1 hour. Approximate time for video rendering is 0.5 hours. Approximate time for video upload to YouTube is 2 hours. Approximate total time for the entire production is 5 hours.

Melissa takes care of the distribution of the video through email and Facebook.

Companion Parish Report

I am hoping to hear from her soon so we are able to share pictures, stories, and prayers with St. Phillips Parish in Uganda.

We were able to send \$2,000.00 to Jason Musoke for the much-required assistance that he was very thankful for in 2020 to help with the children he took care of. On a sad note in 2021 our Rev. Jason passed away suddenly. Please keep his lovely wife Faith and their children in your prayers. The people of St. Francis have been very generous this past year once again.

Compassion Canada

This is an organization very similar to World Vision that supports children throughout the world with their education, health and welfare.

We have supporting children for many years, financially and with prayers and letters. We continue to support one girl and she has a few months left of school, that is when our commitment to Fencan also ends. Angela Williams and Bob Wedlake have been in contact with her throughout this past year.

PWRDF

This stands for Primate's World Relief and Development Fund. The PWRDF is the Anglican Church of Canada's agency for sustainable development and global justice.

With support from parishes across Canada, PWRDF makes financial and human resources available to support partner's initiatives at home and around the world. To find out more information about the work done by this group, find them on the internet at https://pwrdf.org/

Donations can be made by direct deposit to PWRDF as well as through envelopes giving from your St. Francis envelopes and there are envelopes located in the pews for your convenience. The representative for our parish is myself, Rev. Val. Christopherson. We have not met at all in 2020 because of the pandemic which has been unfortunate. There have been Zoom meetings coming up in January and February. I will try my best to be at the virtual meetings.

St. Matthews Emergency Food Bank

All the food we collect here on Sunday morning at our services is donated to St. Matthews Parish Emergency Food Bank. Right now, since we have closed down for quite a few months there has been a basket set at the front entrance of the church. Since before Christmas during our taping of our virtual services many have been dropping off food in the basket and Ted Henderson has been taking it to St. Matthews.

Lenten and Advent Projects

Our projects during Advent and Lenten was not able to happen as we were not able to plan anything do to our closer in 2020. Maybe this lent we can get started with another project. I know in the past we have supported Inner City Youth Alive and The Thelma Wynn project run out of St. Matthews Parish. The Outreach Committee is working on a different way to have project for Lent in 2021.

St. Francis Mission Centre Food Bank

The Food Bank continues to distribute food to a number of families during the pandemic every four weeks from the Mission Centre. The food is delivered by Harvest Manitoba (former Winnipeg Harvest) on Friday and then disturbed to families on the Saturday morning.

I do believe the numbers have declined to 30 to 50 people since the pandemic, but our volunteers are willing to hand out the food to others in need in the community.

In March, the Diocese put restrictions on the age of volunteers who could participate in church food banks. Meaning that there were several people were not able to volunteer due to the pandemic. Since Sept. 2020, the restrictions on volunteers has been lifted and we now have a small but dedicated group of volunteers who unload the truck on Friday and then who distribute the food on Saturday. There are been a few changes during the pandemic. Clients can only receive food every four weeks instead of the previous every two-week schedule.

The food items are now packaged by Manitoba Harvest which makes our job easier. Thank you to all who continue to help out at this ministry and continue to support as this is a very important part of our ministry.

Property Management Report

Property Management Committee AGM Report for 2019

Many thanks to all the Committee Members (Wolfgang, Ross, Ted, and Fran) who continued to participate in one way or another last year, in maintaining our Burrin and McPhillips properties.

While there were no changes to the various groups accessing the Mission Centre in 2020, their physical presence in the building for the majority of the year was drastically reduced. The Harvest Manitoba Food Bank (deemed an essential service), continued to conduct its ministry, following provincial protocols, every two weeks except for the usual two-month summer break (reduced client numbers as well as volunteers attending). The remaining groups were impacted by the lockdowns and subsequent pandemic restrictions: Sparks/Brownies/Guides have not met since the first lockdown, the Ukrainian Evangelical Church only met sporadically when restrictions were relaxed (paid rent, only when they attended) and Epiphany Indigenous Anglican Church have not met since the first lockdown (but continued to pay rent every month).

At the Burrin location, the Church of Christ, the two exercise groups, the senior's social group and the new SAIL group night (Supported Advancement to Independent Living) associated with Kim Sawchuk's employer saw no activity last year once the lockdowns and pandemic restrictions were implemented. As identified in the parish newsletter in November, the rental contract with the Church of Christ group was not renewed after their one-year contract expired on November 30, 2020. All their possessions have subsequently been removed.

Here is a summary of the more notable projects/changes that were undertaken/dealt with in 2020.

Burrin Building:

- Accessible washroom and automated front door project:
 - As a result of the pandemic and the contractor shutting down his business, there are some deficiencies that were not resolved in 2020. We've recently been in contact with him and are attempting to have them addressed.
- Cleaned and painted the concrete slab at the 3 front doors with a built-in gripping paint product.
- All fire extinguishers inspected.
- Repaired and painted the wood cross on top of the belfry (metal brace installed & entire cross wood-puttied).
- Painted the metal cross on the south side.
- Stripped and waxed the basement floor, kitchen floor and chair room.
- Repaired and painted the back door landing and re-carpeted the stairs.
- Painted the chair room.
- Fixed the fascia on the garage and installed shelves.
- Reorganized mop/broom storage closet and utility room workbench.
- Repaired the front sign.
- Repaired under the kitchen sink and reorganized cleaning products.
- Installed new bathroom taps.

McPhillips Building:

• All fire extinguishers inspected and recharged as required.

 - Mission & Outreach was \$434.11 under budget (unable to hold second Coffee House)
 - We received \$12,224.13 in COIVD-19 related subsidy payments (CEWS and MB Bridge Grant)


