*A note from the Bishop to Parish Annual General Meetings*

Dear Friends,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

As you gather for your Annual General Meeting, I want to extend my prayers and gratitude for the faithful ministry you offer in your communities throughout the Diocese of Rupert's Land. An AGM is more than a canonical requirement, it is a sacred moment of discernment, thanksgiving, and hope. It is a time to remember how God has been at work among you, and to listen for how the Holy Spirit is calling you forward. Over the past months, I have witnessed remarkable signs of life across our diocese: renewed worship, deepening discipleship, pastoral care offered with compassion, and bold outreach to neighbours in need. Many of you have taken courageous steps in mission, hospitality, reconciliation, and stewardship. For all of this, I give heartfelt thanks.

As you reflect on the past year, I invite you to consider this theme to guide our diocesan life:

**Christ Among Us: Incarnational Living:** Let us remain rooted in our neighbourhoods, attentive to the needs around us, and confident that Christ is already present and at work. In a world often marked by loneliness, fear, and division, your parish's presence is itself a ministry of hope. In Christ we deepen our communion. Our unity in Christ is both a gift and a responsibility. Continue to nurture relationships within your parish and across the diocese, strengthening the bonds that enable us to pray, learn, and serve together. It is also in Christ that we grow. Christian maturity grows through Scripture, worship, prayer, and shared ministry. I encourage you to consider how your parish is nurturing spiritual formation and encouraging the gifts of all members, young and old.

As you review financial reports and budgets, I also wish to thank you for your faithful support of our Common Mission and Ministry. Your commitment enables us to care for rural parishes, meet our obligations to the wider church, and support diocesan ministries that strengthen us all. I ask that you continue this shared commitment in 2026 as a sign of our mutual responsibility and trust in God's provision.

**A Year of Synod:** The year 2026 will also bring our Diocesan Synod, an important moment of communal discernment and decision-making. I ask each parish to:

- Pray intentionally for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we prepare.
- Discern and elect delegates who will participate fully, prayerfully, and collaboratively.
- Encourage your representatives to enter Synod with openness, hope, and a commitment to the common good of the whole diocese.

Synod is a sign that we walk this journey together, listening for God's call to us as one body.

Looking ahead, I pray that each parish will seek God's guidance with courage and imagination.

The challenges we face (demographic shifts, cultural change, and limited resources) are real, but so too is the power of the Holy Spirit who sustains and renews the Church in every generation.

Please know that I hold each of you in prayer. May your AGM be a time of honest reflection, gracious conversation, and renewed hope in Christ.

**Rector's Warden** – Wayne shares that Fran compliments his flaws and keeps him in line. She provides support where and when he needs it in his ministerial role.

**Mission and Outreach** - Pg 14 PWRDF wording needs to add World – corrected in Report.

**Refugee Committee** - Pg 15 - Working out the details for the sponsor/sponsee. From a high level, the sponsor will provide funding (a certain dollar value per sponsee) and the church assists in holding/dispersing the funds. Could take up to 2 years before the sponsee(s) are able to travel here. The church is required to commit to support the refugees for 1 year, and to help manage their monies, help with getting around and becoming established in the province/community.

**Property Management** - pg 16 – congrats on the install of the new doors into the sanctuary, and the new doors at the main entrance to be installed soon. Thanks expressed to the Building Committee who keep our building up to date.

## 8. Financial Reports

### 2024 Unaudited Statements

- Member Church of God International (MCGI) – This new rental group which meets 7-9pm Wednesday nights, and early Saturday from 2am to noon in the lower level. The Saturday worship service is a livestream from the Philippines. This rental has supported our funds for 2024.
- You will notice the investment income this last year was large with \$7,5000 net.
- Bob Wedlake presented the unaudited Financial Statements for the year ending Dec 31, 2024 reflecting a surplus of <\$1415.66>, against a deficit budget of \$4000.00.
- Page 26: note that an endowment fund is managed by the Diocese. The Church is allowed to draw on the interest gained only, and for whatever purpose they choose, but the principal funds are never available to the Church. This is how the Kozie and Sly Trusts were set up and function.
- The Waldner Trust is slightly different, as it was designed to be specifically used for Outreach purposes only, through the direction of the Church/Vestry.
- Page 27: Smithfield/McPhillips Trust 2025 payment is based on the 2024 year. 4% of \$737,914.88 was paid in May 2025

## 9. Proposed 2025 Budget

- Bob Wedlake, presented the draft Budget for the Operating account with corrections:
- Corrections to the presented Budget on page 29, "Fundraising" of \$1,800 should be removed. "Rentals" needs to be corrected – "Ukrainian group" should be Dance group.
- Amendment under Christian Education - Lenten project increase to \$300. Removing \$300 from the reserve

**MOTION** to increase the Outreach Committee to \$4000 from \$2000. Removing \$2000 from the reserve. Terry Martin moves, Ted Henderson second. **2 opposed MOTION CARRIED**

**Suggestion made to Outreach Committee:** to review a process of determining a percentage based on criteria to provide outreach in accordance with our financial situation. To consider a minimum, if it were a poorer financial year. Outreach Committee to present to Vestry in 2025.

**MOTION:** by Bob Wedlake that the 2025 Budget be approved as amended for St Francis Operating budget with a projected balanced budget for the period. Seconded by Fran Anderson **MOTION CARRIED**

## 10. Bob Wedlake, presented the draft Budget for the Capital account

**MOTION:** by Bob Wedlake that the AGM approve the Capital Fund 2025 Budget for St Francis. Seconded by Rick Yackel. **MOTION CARRIED**

**BE IS RESOLVED** that this Annual General Meeting of the Anglican Parish of St. Francis, Winnipeg, authorize our treasurer, Bob Wedlake, to write a letter to Diocesan Council requesting funds from our Trust Account in the amount of \$30,000 to cover the cost of the new front doors to the building, the cost to fix the issue with the woman's washroom and the cost of the GST related to our insurance claim from August 2023. **MOTION CARRIED**

**MOTION:** by Bob Wedlake that the AGM approve the expense from the Waldner Trust for 2025 for St Francis Operating account. Seconded by Angie Williams. **MOTION CARRIED**

### **Refugee Committee**

Since meeting Marlene Smith, chair of the Diocesan Refugee committee, at synod 2024 I had the privilege of learning how to sponsor a refugee and how our church could get involved. I am grateful our Vestry decided to become part of this journey on changing people's lives.

During the sponsorship process we considered a variety of individuals to sponsor. Finally in July 2025 we submitted an application for Zahir Arbab and to our delight the application was approved. This surprised us because we were all under the impression that this process could take 2 years or longer and not just a few months. On December 9th our refugee arrived. The excitement at the airport was palpable, with all the family members there after over 16 years of being apart. The tears that came down everyone faces was so moving.

Zahir is 35 years old. He was born in Darfur, Sudan. Due to the political unrest, he fled to Cario for his safety where he remained as a refugee for over 5 years. Living every day, looking over his shoulder, must have been terrifying for him. He is now safe and starting his new life in Canada.

Since Zahir arrived, he and his family have come to a few of our events and had an amazing time. He came to our Christmas Eve Mass on December 24th and to our New Year's Eve Party December 31st. Also, our church is planning a welcoming potluck supper. The date will be announced in near future.

Our committee and I are so happy, with no words to explain how we are able to help change lives and are looking forward to sponsoring again.

## Special Events

### **Murder Mystery “Breaking Point” – February 1, 2025**

Since the early eighteen hundreds the lighthouse marked the remote gateway to Breaking Point, warning the mariner and protecting ships from the dangers of the sea. Faithfully and loyally, Willard Dobbs upheld the family tradition and kept a light glowing nightly in the old stone tower.

For the first time in two hundred years there was no light in the Breaking Point Lighthouse.

Willard Dobbs’ body was found sprawled on the top of the lighthouse staircase. He had been murdered, a gunshot wound to the head, and our evening began.

There were 8 actors and each one had their own scripts to play throughout the night. Everyone was laughing and having a good time all evening long. It was a very big success.

The meal consisted of a Caesar salad and French bread, pork tenderloin w/mushroom gravy, roasted potatoes, maple dill carrots, and chocolate cake with vanilla ice cream. Received lots of good comments about the meal. The cost was \$25 and we made \$2,115.16

Thanks to the performers, to those who prepared the meal, and those who cleaned up afterwards. Thanks to Bob Wedlake for organizing the event and doing all that he does to prepare for the evening.

### **PANCAKE LUNCH – March 2, 2025**

Served right after the church service, we had pancakes, sausages, and sliced oranges. It was fairly well attended and everyone enjoyed the meal. Cost was \$8 and we made \$146.78.

Thanks to those who prepared the meal and those who did the clean up afterwards.

### **ST. FRANCIS FAIR - May 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025**

The fair started Friday May 9 with the booths & kitchen opening at 5pm. There were booths for the bake table, books, clothing, grocery hamper, take a chance, plants, wheel of prizes, indoor yard sale and silent auction. The kitchen was opened from 5pm to 7pm, serving meat pie, chicken finger dinner and lasagna dinner (meat or veggie). The cost for all dinners was \$12.

## 2025 Financial Report (see attached statements)

### **Balance Sheet: (page 20)**

- Shows the assets and liabilities held by the parish.
- The parish's worth increased by \$132,300.05 largely due to the increase property assessment, the increase in the Smithfield/McPhillips Trust Fund and the increase in the Capital Fund.

### **Operating Account: (pages 21 – 23)**

- Ended 2025 with a SURPLUS of \$3,581.88 against a balanced budget.
- Income was \$716.89 under budget:
  - Offerings were \$3,126.55 under budget.
  - Fundraising was \$2,385.80 over budget (even without having the Spring Tea as budgeted).
  - Rentals were \$1,042.80 over budget (13 hall rentals over the year).
  - Interest was on budget.
  - GST Rebate was on budget.
  - Mission & Outreach was \$1,000.00 under budget (Coffee House did not happen as budgeted).
- Expenses were \$4,298.77 under budget:
  - Clergy was \$1,624.92 under budget (Budget error on benefits and Fr. Wayne did not attend the clergy conference in 2025).
  - Diocesan pledge was on budget.
  - Property Management was \$2,579.13 under budget. Utilities were over budget; Insurance and Taxes were pretty much on budget; Caretaker and Grounds (snow removal) was on budget; Building Maintenance was \$3,171.08 under budget (some planned work did not get done).
  - Christian Education was \$187.24 under budget (Bible Study was less than planned).
  - Finance & Administration was \$311.63 over budget due to unplanned purchase of a printer for the office.
  - Worship and Mission & Outreach were on budget.

### **Other Funds & Trust Accounts: (pages 24 – 27)**

- Capital Fund – received \$1,830.50 in interest; received \$97.74 GST rebate from 2024 expenses on capital projects; received \$30,000.00 from the Smithfield / McPhillips Trust; paid to replace front doors (\$17,162.17), repairs to the women's washroom (\$1,397.97) and to upgrade the kitchen fire suppression system (\$2,878.40).
- Reserved Fund – received \$1,091.12 in GIC interest and then transferred that to the Operating Account; \$3,850.00 was transferred from the Operating Account as per budget.
- Memorial Fund – received \$44.11 in interest; purchased a new laptop and monitor (\$531.78) to use to project the service. Some minor repairs were made to the banners.

## ST. FRANCIS ANGLICAN CHURCH

- Renter's Deposit-MCGI – received \$10.59 in interest; moved the balance (\$822.80) to operating account to cover their last month's rent. This fund is now closed.
- Flowers Fund – created a new fund for surplus donations towards flowers in 2025 (\$199.30)
- Refugee Fund – created a new fund to put aside \$1,000 in 2025 to support our sponsored refugee. Interest of \$1.19 was earned
- Waldner Trust – received \$8.21 in interest; spent \$250 on the Sisler High School Scholarship.
- Kozie Trust – the investment fund gained \$6,917.95 in 2024; 7% interest payout of \$3,001.41 was received and transferred to the Operating Account in 2025.
- Sly Trust – the investment fund gained \$559.58 in 2024; 7% interest payout of \$242.78 was received and transferred to the Operating Account in 2025.
- Smithfield /McPhillips Trust – the investment fund gained \$101,189.16 in 2025 and had admin fees of \$3,949.50; 7% interest payout of \$51,654.04 was received and transferred to the Operating Account; Diocese Admin Fees \$1,844.79 & Audit Fees \$2,240.33 were paid; a withdrawal of \$30,000.00 was made and transferred to the Capital Fund for capital projects.

### 2026 Proposed Budgets: (pages 28 & 29)

- Projecting a deficit budget of \$8,700.00 for the Operating Account.
  - Note the interest budget is based on a 7% distribution. The "normal" distribution of 4% would be \$24,400 less and would have resulted in a deficit budget of \$33,100.
- Projecting to spend \$19,500 from the Capital Fund.
- Projecting to spend \$250 from the Waldner Trust to support the Sisler High School scholarship.






